## Yukon First Nation Language Immersion I (INLG 158)

Provides intensive and culture-based language instruction in a specific Yukon language at the beginner level. Offered in Hän, Southern Tutchone, Gwich'in, Upper Tanana, Northern Tutchone, Tlingit, Tagish, & Kaska.

**Course availability is dependent on camps taking place in partnering First Nations**
